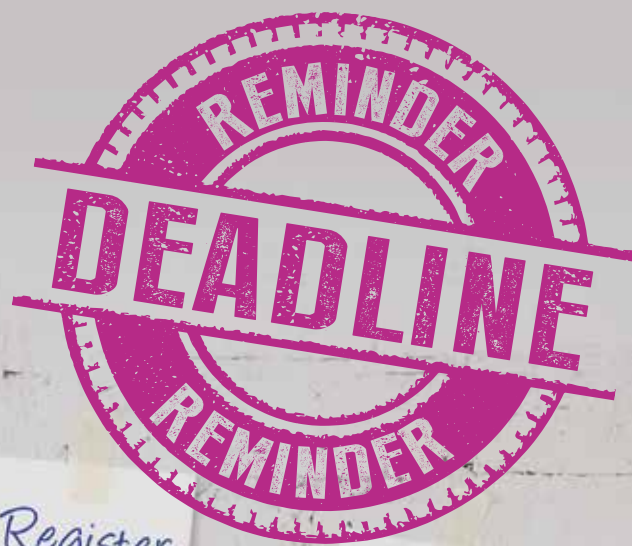

# Deadline Reminder



Register

1<sup>st</sup>  
December



## **This is a reminder to all Members of the Bluefaced Leicester Sheep Breeders Association who have lambs to register this year.**

The last date for registration's free of charge has now passed – if you have not already fully registered your lambs you will now be subject to a late registration fee of £15 per lamb to fully register. This fee is to be paid by the breeder and you have up to the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2023 to do this, after that no animals born in 2022 will be able to be fully registered. All ET lambs must be declared at the time of Registration.

You can either complete the Registration form that was sent to you at the time you ordered your Association Tags or you can do your registrations on line on the Grassroots Database.

If you require another copy of your form or your passcode for the database please do not hesitate to contact the Office and we will issue these for you.

**\*Please remember if you do not return your registrations on time you will not appear in the Flock Book and you will not be issued with Association Tags for next year's lambs until your paperwork is up to date**

A Traditional type Shearling sold at Bulth Wells for 26,000gns from T R Harris Bonvilston, which is a breed

record for Bulth Wells and a ram lamb from Mr M Gray Espley sold at Carlisle for £23,000

I must give a special mention to David Raine who stepped down as a Trustee of the association at the AGM in May. David has been a depth of knowledge and advice to the management of trustees over the past 21 years, thank you on behalf of the members for the time you have given to the association. Mr Jim German is now a trustee of the association.

### 2023 Subscriptions / Members Details

**The Annual Subscription for the Association remains at £25.00. This is collected by Standing Order on the 1<sup>st</sup> working day of the new year. If you have opted to pay your membership by cheque, please be aware reminders are not sent out.**

Southern Ireland members can pay their annual subscription fee by Euro cheque, unfortunately paying by standing order is not an option for Southern Ireland members (unless you have a £'s Sterling bank account).

Please be aware non-paid-up members are automatically excluded from our mailing list.

If you would like to set up a standing order to make sure your payment is received on time, then please contact the office for an application form. If you change bank account, you will need to check that your standing order instruction is set up to be paid out from the new account.

If you move house and/or your contact details change, please notify the office as soon as you can so that we can keep our database as up to date as possible.

### Registration Forms - Change of Registration Date

**The date for the return of your completed registration forms has changed.**

The **1<sup>st</sup> of December 2022** is the last date for registration forms to be filed with the office and online registrations to be completed to register lambs born in 2022 free of charge. If you wish to register lambs after this date there is a late registration charge of £15 per sheep, this fee is to be paid by the breeder and you have up to 30<sup>th</sup> June 2023 to do this, after this date no lambs for 2022 will be able to be registered. All tags for lambs born in 2022 must have been purchased in the year of birth, you will not be able to buy tags for lambs born in 2022 in 2023.

To access the grassroots system you will need your membership number (as a five-digit number - using leading zero's where necessary) and your passcode. If you have forgotten your Grassroots passcode, please contact the office and we will be happy to send you a reminder.

You can send your completed registration forms by Post (please include a SAE if you require proof of receipt), Scanned e-mail copy, Facebook Messenger and by WhatsApp (07818515488). **Please note the office can no longer accept FAXES.**

### Replacement Tags

**If you need to order replacement Bluefaced Leicester ear tags this must be done through the Association office and not direct from the tag company.**

The following details are required; -

- Bluefaced Leicester side of the tag details
- UK flock number with individual number
- Your CPH number.

If it is a bought in animal and not your own breeding, we require proof of purchase - either by supply of the original tag you are replacing or an Auctioneers invoice (this will be returned to you once the order is placed).

If all this information can be supplied at the time of ordering, then it will allow us to improve the service to you the members. There is normally a five day turn around on replacement tag orders from the date of order. There is no charge for supply of replacement Bluefaced Leicester tags for 2022.

If you have forgotten your Grassroots password, please contact the office and we will be happy to send you a reminder.

## Performance Recording

There is an opportunity for members who Performance Record to claim back monies to assist with Performance Recording costs. If you are a Performance Recording Member and wish to make a claim please send copy of your AHDB Invoices for Membership and Scanning (this invoice must show the number of Bluefaced Leicester lambs scanned) and the 50% refund will be arranged for you from the Association office. The monies available are on a 'first come first served' basis. Please contact the office to see if you are eligible to make a claim.

# FROM THE ARCHIVES

## Exert taken from Volume 1 of the Flock book (1963)

### Message Published in the First Flock Book from the First Association Chairman Mr J W Raine

It has been my privilege in this, the first year of the Bluefaced Leicester Sheep Breeders Association, to be Chairman of the Council of Management. I would like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the willingness of each and every member to do everything possible to see the Association off to a splendid start. We can now look back on what I think has been a very successful year. The quality of the stock at our annual sales, with very few exceptions, was extremely high. The breed has continued to expand, not only in numbers, but is also proving a suitable cross on an increasing number of hill breeds.

As an Association we should fully appreciate that it must be the Bluefaced Leicester's crossing ability on which the breed will stand or fall.

The pattern of our sheep industry is well established. The hill breeds, when suitably crossed, will continue to supply the lowland farmer with a ewe most suitable for the economical production of fat lambs. In this general pattern our breed is well established. By the continued improvement in conformation, prolificacy and milking ability we can continue to expand and play an increasingly important role in the future.

In this, the first volume of the flock book, the particulars must, of necessity, be brief, but I am convinced that as more details become available in future volumes, it will be a great asset to Breeders.

# This is Your Life

featuring Trevor Simpson, Retired Auctioneer,  
Hexham Auction Mart

As everyone in the livestock industry knows one of the most important jobs in the sheep world is the Auctioneer, and we, the Bluefaced Leicester Association have been lucky to have one of the best in the business sell our sheep for the past 35 years. Trevor Simpson of Hexham & Northern Marts has been the man to oversee some of our Association sales and in recognition of his time and dedication to the breed we have done a small interview with him, here is his story.

## **What is your Family Background?**

My family: my grandfather was a butcher, but my father did not follow on the family business after his death; mother's family were farming family from Steel Hall in Hexhamshire and my cousin still farms there today.

## **Did you always want to be an Auctioneer? Or did Auctioneering choose you?**

No. When I left school I wanted to be a draftsman and I went to Hexham District Council to work in the surveyor's office but after one and a half years I realised that it wasn't for me. Then a job as an auctioneer's clerk came up at Hexham Auction Mart and that's when I joined the mart.

## **You have worked at Hexham Mart all your life – can you tell us about your work journey through the Company?**

I started at the mart as an auctioneer's clerk. Then after a few years I got my first chance to sell at a farm stock sale. From this I went onto calves and stirks, then young store cattle following onto store and breeding sheep. I then moved onto the prime sheep and all store cattle and sheep sales. I am now classed as the senior auctioneer – because of my age! During the earlier years I assisted Maurice Reed preparing the furniture sales at Rothbury.

## **Who are the Auctioneer's who have influenced you the most?**

Arthur and Billy Iveson in particular Arthur. I always thought I would like to be as good an auctioneer as Arthur and hope I have come somewhere near. Maurice Reed taught me everything I know about the valuation side.

## **When did you start selling Bluefaced Leicesters at Hexham?**

It is a long time ago, but I think about 1985/86.

## **Most memorable Bluefaced Leicester Selling Moment?**

Most memorable BFL selling moment was when I was given the opportunity to sell the BFL lambs at Hexham but also being asked by Arthur and Caroline Yates to sell their noted Millhouse Flock in January 1996 then the Linkins and Hazelwood Flocks.

## **You have sold Bluefaced Leicesters around the Country including at Kelso and Builth Wells – tell us more about these important days in the sale calendar from an Auctioneer's perspective.**

I look forward each year going to Kelso – as this is one of the main events on the auctioneer's calendar. I

started attending Kelso around 1980 clerking to Arthur and Maurice. I started selling cross rams but eventually moved onto the BFL's. It was a great experience and honour to sell noted consignments, such as West Bolton, Edlingham New Town and West Cocklaw and many others. Also to meet so many great people and make friends from all over the country, many who you only see once a year. Builth Wells is another important day on the BFL circuit. I started going there, again clerking, and then selling with Michael and Andrew Walton and also Maurice Reed, under the Michael Walton Auctioneer banner. The quality of BFL rams at Builth has gone from strength to strength since I first started. My last time selling Bluefaced Leicesters at Builth was in 2020.

#### **How do you think the use of social media platforms has improved the promotion of Sheep in General?**

Social media is expanding and improving all the time, being able to help the selling and promotion of all stock greatly. We are able to communicate with so many more people all over the country by sending photos of stock that they might be interested in, that are coming up in the auction sales.

#### **The Auction Marts still play a vital role for the farmer to sell his stock, do you feel with more online sales coming through that the Auction Marts will become a thing of the past?**

Yes, there are more online sales, but they will not take the place of live auctions. Consigners like to show their stock and years work to a full ring of people and also purchasers can see the stock and buy with confidence. The auction mart is also a social meeting place not only for present farmers but also retired, they get together to talk about farming, trade and other issues, in the sale ring or in the mart café.

#### **If you had the chance to do it all over again what piece of advice would you give to yourself?**

Listen you daft bugger!! Learn from older and wiser colleagues, take on board what they say as they have done it before. Gaining the confidence of sellers and purchasers is vital and to be honest, as I was told when I first started by Arthur Iveson "The customer is always right even when they are wrong." Just enjoy yourself in the box.

After 50 years of working at Hexham Mart Trevor has now decided to hang up his gavel and enjoy retirement with his wife Amanda and Family in the Weardale valley. As a token of appreciation the Association made a small presentation to Trevor on behalf of the members at his retirement party in May 2022.

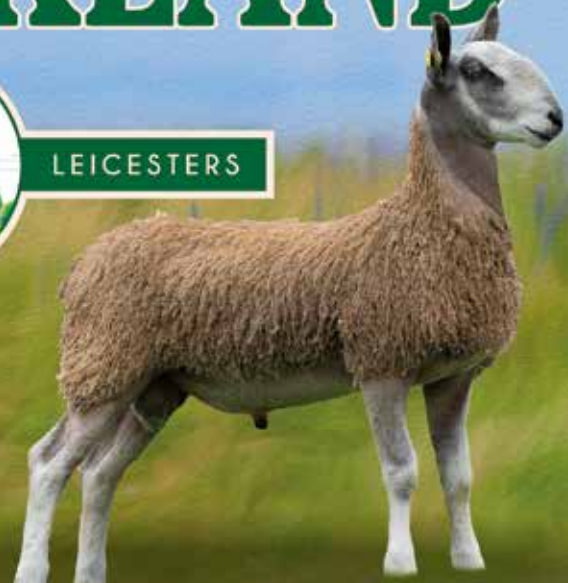

# News from the Regions...

## Scotland

**As I write this report on the activities of 2022 the countryside in Scotland is at its most beautiful with all the glory of the autumn colours. Our tried and tested rams of the past years and our new incumbents are hopefully well through their duties successfully. We look forward to the resultant offspring with great hopes at the start of what is yet another breeding season.**

Since being elected as Scottish Chairman at the beginning of February, we have had what I consider as an encouraging year. New Council members were appointed at our AGM, and I would like to acknowledge with thanks all the hard work and commitment over the years of our retiring members.

Weather at lambing time in this Northern part of the UK was generally benign. Temperatures were generally above average, and grass started growing from a few days to a few weeks earlier than usual, depending on your location. The next event was the R.H.A.S.S. After two years with no show as we know it, the atmosphere was easily felt by everyone as they were able to get out and about and enjoy the social and business side of the event.

The two BFL sections were well supported by a great show of high-quality sheep.

The traditional section was well up to the numbers of previous years. Judged by myself, the overall champion, shown by the McClymont family was the aged tup Bonvilston N11, bred by Tudor Harris in Wales. Female and reserve overall champion

was a very good quality gimmer from Lisa Fleming, a relatively new member, from Falnash flock.

The crossing type section, very ably judged by Alex Brown from the Macqueston Flock, was won by a very smart stylish gimmer from the Wight family at Midlock. Reserve Champion from the tup lamb class was a very smart lamb from Alan McQuistin from Barnshangan.

The show was a huge success with two sections of very high-quality, well-presented sheep. Although this year we did not have a presence in the NSA tent, which had moved to a new site, we were able to host our "members reception" undercover at the shearing stand, this was well attended and a great party for our supporters and friends. Thank you to Hazel Brown and her helpers for all their hard work.

After the Highland, it was a great lift to everyone's spirits to have our Summer shows taking place. Most had a good attendance with people just glad to be out and about. Entries were slightly down in most events but hopefully they will build back up again over time.

Peebles Show was again the venue for the Progeny Show for both traditional and crossing types. In a very well supported traditional section the Kirkstead flock took both Champion and reserve tickets with an aged tup and a two-crop ewe. The Bonvilston bred tup following on from its win at the Highland. The progeny classes in this section were also won by Kirkstead.

The crossing section drew entries from a wide area and was won by a gimmer from Midlock. Reserve Champion was also a gimmer from Finlay Robertson of the Beeches Flock.

The Progeny and mule sections were both won by Messrs Archer from Carry House. The show was a huge success and many thanks to the two judges Derek Henderson and Andrew Hunter for doing great work in what was extreme heat for both people and livestock.

Scottish Ram sales kicked off with Kelso back in its usual format, all rings under cover. This was very fortunate. Sale day and the previous day were two of the wettest in 2022. The overall average for 396 tups sold was slightly down but this was mainly due to the lower top prices. The demand for strong, sound, commercial tups was still strong.

Castle Douglas shearling average was down a little but a small number of lambs enjoyed a substantial rise of over £200 to average £914.

Builth Wells and Carlisle sales do not come under the Scottish area, but the highest priced rams from both sales came to Scotland. The £26,000 ram from Builth Wells joining the Leadburnlea Flock and the £23,000 lamb from Carlisle coming to Kirkstead. We wish Hazel Brown and the McClymonts every success with them. Likewise, the two top priced lambs at Hawes came to Scotland at £40,000 each. The first was shared between Midlock, Allanfauld and Flash House. The second shared by Blarnavaid and Drimsynie. Best wishes to them also and thanks for keeping Scotlands quality stock to the fore.

In Mid October we are at the start of another cycle in the breeding of Bluefaced Leicesters. The previous twelve months have seen some return to normality. Sheep prices have remained reasonably strong, but they are all needed in these days of rising costs.

Thank you to Helen, Rachael and all our members for all their hard work and support throughout the last year.

We look forward to meeting everyone at events over the next year. Dates and venues will be published in due course.

# Mule Group News

The promotional year for Mule group started with funding from the Bluefaced Leicester Association to make short videos for each of the Mule Associations under the Banner of "Source to Sea".

This was an excellent idea from Linda Allan who compared the sheep stratification system to a river flowing down the hillside, as it descends, it gathers momentum and becomes more bountiful, much like mule sheep. The videos were very well received with many thousands of views on the relevant Facebook pages, whilst there were some things that we could have done differently, it was an excellent first attempt and from discussions, other breed societies will look to get involved with joint videos going forward. The main point was to reinforce the stratification system which continues to serve the industry well, both in terms of upland economic prosperity and unrivalled physical performance.

Throughout the year Jonathan Hodgson and I have been working hard to cultivate relationships with the Royal Veterinary College of London who have been comparing the performance of Mules with other low ground crosses. Whilst the work is at an early stage, there have been some very interesting findings.

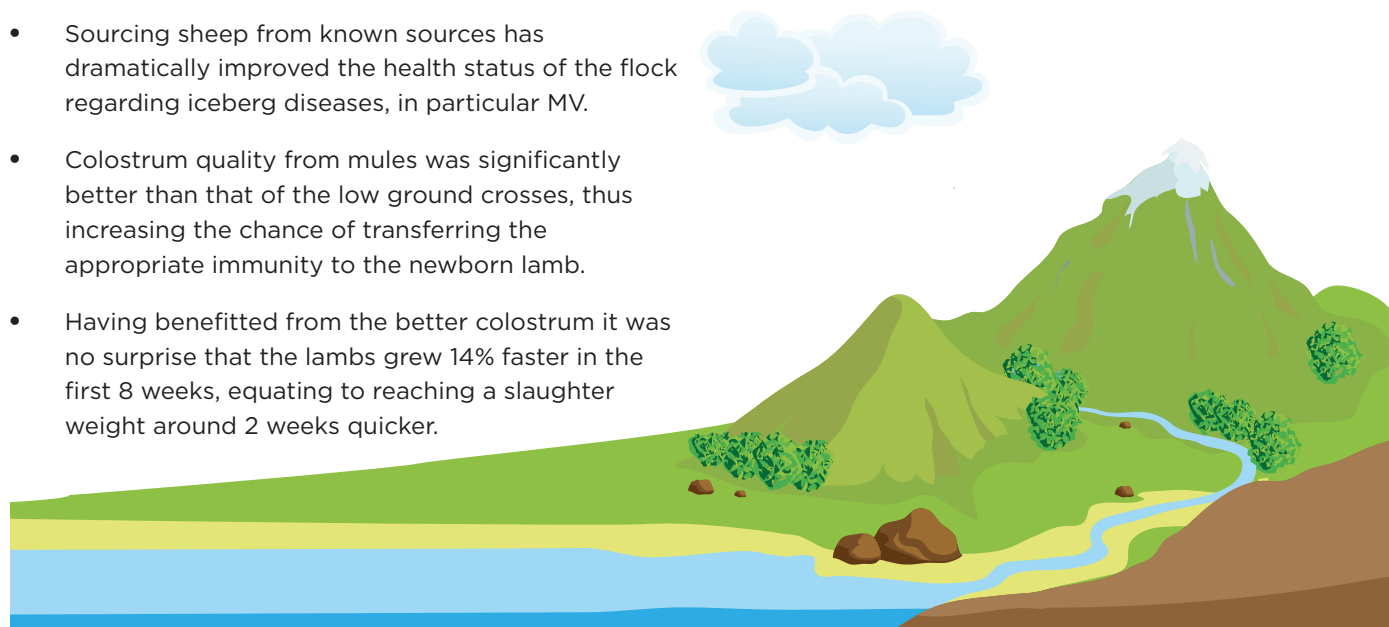
- Sourcing sheep from known sources has dramatically improved the health status of the flock regarding iceberg diseases, in particular MV.
- Colostrum quality from mules was significantly better than that of the low ground crosses, thus increasing the chance of transferring the appropriate immunity to the newborn lamb.
- Having benefitted from the better colostrum it was no surprise that the lambs grew 14% faster in the first 8 weeks, equating to reaching a slaughter weight around 2 weeks quicker.

This excellent work is ongoing, credit must go to Graham Webster and his team for their dedication to the tasks. Going forward as well as looking to rerun the colostrum quality trial, we are looking to link the colostrum quality to mortality of the lambs to six weeks of age. They are also looking to do a full carbon footprint study on a batch of mules to see how they perform against climate criteria in a low ground situation.

As ever I welcome feedback, good or bad from anyone. If you have any ideas for further promoting the number one commercial ewe in the industry, please get in touch.

Finally I would like to thank Rachael Marston and the Bluefaced Leicester Association for their continued support.

# Producing Mules since 1985

Mr T Staunton, MASK VIEW 4061

The farm is located In Tourmakeady, Co.Mayo in the West of Ireland by the shores of Lough Mask with the Party mountain range as a back drop. The land is a mixture from shallow clay soil to heavy peaty ground which rises to 995ft in the hills. Much of the farm is fragmented, not ideal for moving stock.

Tom has been married to his wife Maura for the past forty years and they have 6 children, 3 daughters and 3 sons. Whom all have played their part over the years from helping at lambing with pet lambs to prepping sheep for sales. Away from the farm, in the wintertime Tom enjoys playing and watching darts and has played on the county darts team over the years. Tom also enjoys watching football both GAA & soccer and when he gets a chance you will find him down on the lake fishing for brown trout.

Tom farms along with his 3 sons Michael, Thomas and Kevin who all work off farm too.

The farm goes back 4 generations with Tom taking over the farm in 1980 from his father Michael over 42 years ago. The farm was a mixed stock farm of suckler cows and sheep which remained that way for many years until recently where it is now all sheep, which they graze 100 acres and have shares in a hill commonage, and they lease a further 60 acres.

The farm is a sheep enterprise based predominantly on the production of Mule lambs. Tom explained " We have 35 Bluefaced Leicester ewes plus replacement ewe hoggets and we breed our own Blackface (Lanark type) replacement ewes and buy some replacements in also. We have sold Mule ewe lambs at the Mayo Mule & Greyface annual sales in Ballinrobe which I helped establish 1985. My first ewe lambs sold for £52/head. We have achieved €260 for Mule ewe lambs and averaged €200/head for 120 lambs in 2021. We have many repeat customers, with one customer buying from us for over 26 years".

The Department of Agriculture worked with farmers to develop Mule breeding sales in hill areas throughout Ireland in the Mid 80's. The first Blue rams were bought

by the Department of Agriculture in Kelso in 1985 and these were then leased to farmers who were just setting up Mule sales. Tom leased one of these rams that first year and everything has taken off from there. The Maskview flock of Pedigree Bluefaced Leicesters was established in 1986. Tom explained there were no breeders of Bluefaced Leicesters in their part of Ireland at the time and he had to travel to Northern Ireland to buy his first breeding females from the Wauchope brothers in Co.Tyrone. In 1987 Tom bought another ram from the Department of Agriculture. Tom explained "The advisor told me they had a new consignment of imported rams bought in, but farmers didn't want one of the rams. I asked what was wrong with him, the answer was that he was too dear!! I bought him, an Old Parks bred ram. He bred very well for me for many years and some great female lines came from him for many years".

Tom was asked if there was any particular ram that has had an impact on the flock? Tom explained "There have been several rams over the years that have had an impact on the flock. Buying a stock ram isn't easy and is a very selective job as he can have a huge impact on a flock for years. It can be difficult to know how good a ram will be and it's only when you have lambs out of him, you know".

Tom continued to say "I bought 2 champion rams out of Ballymena sale from Timothy Wray Knockstacken 2 years consecutively. The first was a Knockstacken bred ram and the other a Beechlodge bred ram that Timothy had purchased the year previous. This ram had great body and was an Elite plus ram at the time. The first time we A.I'd ewes in the flock we purchased frozen semen from Allan Wight, Midlock. We used Midlock Controversy and the following years Tanhouse B004. Both rams bred very well and left a mark on the flock. This was our

first major shift to crossing type Bluefaced Leicesters. More recently we purchased in co with Joe Scahill, Faughburren, Mullaghwee K001 from Michelle Wright & Seamus O'Kane. A ram by Parkgatestone G004. He has a left tremendous mark on the flock, with great coats, colours and great bodied sheep. We have some great breeding ewes out of him. We then purchased a ram from Graham & Julie Loughery Temain P009 (Temain Hollywood) by the Hawes Champion 2019 (Yore House Maverick). He has bred great clean colours and character into his offspring both in Blues & Mules".

Bluefaced Leicesters suit the farm because of the land type and they have been the most profitable breed for the family when crossed with Blackface ewes on marginal land to produce female replacements for lowland breeders. All the wether lambs on farm are 'finished' too. Keeping good conformation and body in the mule lambs is important for both the ewe lambs and wether lambs.

Tom explained the family have had many successes at different shows and sales over the years but their greatest showing achievements to date are selling the top priced female at the in-lamb female sale in Carrick On Shannon in 2020. Also, winning 1st prize and Champion in Ballinrobe sale with different ram lambs over the years.

The majority of the Bluefaced Leicester rams are sold mainly at the Premier sale in Ballinrobe in September. Also selling at the Ballybofey/Stranolar sale a couple of weeks later. Females are sold at the in-lamb sale in

December in Carrick On Shannon. Stock is also sold privately to returning regular customers. Tom enjoys attending sales and shows and meeting up friends from all over Ireland & UK.

When selecting a stock ram Tom is looking for a ram with some proven Mule breeding bloodlines. Looking for a nice tight coated sheep, good cocky head and ears, some character with proud stance, good conformation.

Mask Views best sales achievement was topping the in-lamb female sale in December 2020 with an in-lamb shearling ewe by the K001 Mullaghwee carrying twins to Temain P009. Sold for €2,150.

Looking to the future Tom hopes to "continue to improve the flock by incorporating the best genetics into the flock. I look to keep the prolificacy, milkiness in the Bluefaced Leicesters that I produce. We performance record all our Bluefaced Leicesters and use it as a tool to help us establish the best breeding sheep. Passing on these traits to Mule breeders is key to us. If Mules are performing for commercial farmers that is what will keep demand for the breed. Breeding rams that have correct functional traits such as mouths and legs is something that cannot be forgotten about as longevity is something commercial farmers desire". "We intend to retain some more ram lambs, use them on our Blackface ewes and sell them as proven shearlings. Many customers like a shearling ram as they can cover more ewes and they have most of their growing done. We can see a great future for the Bluefaced Leicester breed as they have adapted and changed over time".

# BURNDALE BLUEFACED LEICESTERS

Mr D W Henderson, Burndale Flock 65

Nestled near the town of Allendale which is within the North Pennines area of outstanding natural beauty you will find the original home of the Burndale flock of Traditional Bluefaced Leicesters.

The flock which is run now by Derek Henderson, was originally started by Derek's grandfather Johnny and his father Eddie and was one of the first to be registered.

In 1962 when the Association was formed there were 165 flocks registered and flocks were numbered in alphabetical order – Burndale were given the number 65. Many more flocks followed as popularity grew.

Between 1969 and 1970 Derek's father Eddie had the honour of being National Chairman of the Association.

The flock was established at the family farm Burn Tongues where it remained until the early 1990's when there was a split in the business. Derek moved to Finney Hill Green where there were no cattle sheds, so he took the sheep side of the business. As well as Mules and Swaledales, Derek also ran a flock of pedigree Suffolks which he did successfully until 2010, but it has always been the Bluefaced Leicester which has remained as Derek's favourite. Derek's brother John remained at Burn Tongues where he continued with the suckler herd and went on to establish the Burndale pedigree Limousin herd with his two sons Kevin and Mark.

In 2014 Derek was now farming at Low Struthers Farm, Allendale with his son David who had returned home after several years working as a shepherd in the Scottish Borders. With Derek's two other children Richard and Melanie having followed other paths it is David who now

runs Low Struthers where he runs 350 commercial ewes as well as having established his own flock of Bluefaced Leicesters under the prefix 'North Burndale' using bloodlines from the Burndale flock. David is a very accomplished breeder and trainer of border collies having recently sold the homebred 'Burndale Cash' at the Dolgellau auction reaching a new male record of £25,500.

Derek and his wife Catherine, live at Westwood Farm, nr Wylam where he keeps 40 Bluefaced Leicester ewes, 20 followers and Mules and Texel cross commercials. Derek likes his Bluefaced Leicesters to have good scale and confirmation, good bone and skin, clean white hair, good mouth and plenty of milk, it is important to Derek to keep breeding sheep that are correct and true to type.

Rams are usually sold as ram lambs at Carlisle, Bulth Wells, Kelso and Hexham. Derek has enjoyed good trade for his rams over the years and one very notable achievement was when Burndale G001 was sold as a lamb to the Kirkstead Flock of Alan McClymont in 2014 where he went on to greatness in the show ring. Alan went on to show the ram at the Royal Highland Show in 2016 taking the overall championship in the traditional section, he returned to the Royal Highland show two years later in 2018 not only taking the overall championship title but with the reserve champion took the Overall Interbreed pairs championship, with the Crossing Type pair of Bluefaced Leicesters taking the Reserve Interbreed pairs

championship, a fantastic achievement for breeders and the breed. And to top off G1's showing days he was named 'Champion of the Decade' in a parade of Royal Highland Show champions posted in the Scottish Farmer newspaper back in 2020. Another influential ram bred by Derek was his K004 Burndale which was sold to Frank Johnson for his Ashes flock and it has bred very well, along with several other Burndale rams sold to breeders around the country.

Last year Derek and David purchased Carlisle sale champion Piel View P002 from Scott Thomason for £10,000 and he has bred very well already within both flocks leaving his stamp alongside the three other stock rams.

Traditionally the Bluefaced Leicesters have been used on Swaledales and Blackface Ewes but there is an increasing demand to use Bluefaced Leicesters on different breeds mainly the cheviot ewe. The Cheviot ewe is easily fleshed and are a very thrifty sheep with good skin, which lasts well and they produce a very good cheviot mule lamb, for this reason Derek and David are both confident the traditional Bluefaced Leicester has a very bright future.

He took the accolades at the Welsh progeny show last year and his run in the showing continued for this son of the L1 Burndale, which has done well for the Kirkstead flock, with his first crop of lambs looking well. Kirkstead also took the reserve female champion spot with a aged ewe and also the gimmer lamb class went to them also, completing a great day for the flock.

The Champion female and reserve overall champion came from new breeder, Lisa Fleming from the Falnash, Teviot Head, who established her flock after buying at the 2020 Blue Belles sale at Carlisle, where she purchased a Kirkstead ewe. This ewe by the Mendick tup was carrying the days female champion, by the M3 Leadburnlea when it arrived and the Highland was its first outing, and what an outing it was, pushing the Kirkstead tup close all the way. This sweet gimmer has a great future in front of her and it will be interesting to see how she develops.

The Philiphaugh flock from Sir Strang-Steel enjoyed a strong showing on the day, taking the reserve male championship with a 2-shear ram, which stood second in its class to the Bonvilston tup. This boy was a bargain purchase at the Kelso sale last year when they forked out a mere £1000 from the Gefrin flock. This boy is by a Mendick sire and has done well, both in himself and how he has got. The flock also took the tup shearing class too, with a strong tup by the £6000 P3 Towdypotts.

The tup lamb class was won by the Kildalloig flock with a smart lamb by the D3 Derwenlas out of a Howlea ewe. The group of 3 saw the Kirkstead just pip the Low Espley flock to first place.

Both sections enjoyed a great show with some tremendous sheep on show, and it was good to be back at a normal Highland show, with plenty of onlookers around the ringside. We look forward to next year and even more entries in what must be one of the shows strongest sections.

With some very strong classes it wasn't an easy job to sort out, but when the judging was all done and dusted it was a familiar face at the top of the tree again, as Midlock proved yet again to be the team to beat.

Their champion was a stonking gimmer, which just oozed class. She is the full sister to the £40,000 "Commander" lamb sold last autumn at Hawes, by the M1 Riddings and out of the flocks top breeding ewe Midlock L27. Midlock also took the reserve female championship with an aged ewe by the K1 Shafthill out of an E1 Barfhouse.

Winning the male championship and going on to take the reserve overall championship was a smart tup lamb from Alan McQuistin, Barnshangan. This cocky lamb was full of power and a lovely colour, and again full of Midlock bloodlines. He was sired by the legendary G34 Midlock and

out of a ewe by the J14 Blarnavaid, a son of Highberries Hotshot. Its full sister took the gimmer lamb class too, to complete a great double for these lambs. The reserve male champion was a corking home bred tup shearling from the Beeches flock from Finlay Robertson, by the L22 Blarnavaid and out of a ewe by the B41 Hewgill which has done so well for the flock. # J Carr

## Homilton Flock 620

Farming at the best of times is not an easy life, but when farming in amongst the quarry holes of your abandoned local quarry it makes things a little more tricky. This is exactly how John Carr, together with wife Angela and son John spend their days, working land on their hill farm in amongst the old sandstone quarry of Camphill. The farm sits 700ft above sea level on the outskirts of the village of Gunnerton in Northumberland, this is home to the Homilton flock of crossing type Bluefaced Leicesters. Together with other rented land the Carr's farm a total of 1000 acres.

The Homilton flock was first established in 1972 at Homilton Farm, nr Capheaton, and began as a traditional flock, some of the early sires used were Carry House J1, Whitchester 352/K7, 365/K4 Mosser Mains and Wallholme. In 1976 John with new wife Angela, and the flock moved with him to the banks of the River South Tyne to the hamlet of Warden where a few years later son John was born. It was during this time John managed to develop his love of horse riding, and enjoyed nothing more than riding in the local point to point at Tynedale and he even managed to get a few winners under his

belt, two of his favourite horses were Good Prospect and Cuckoo's Cottage. The family stayed at Warden until 1982 when they established their own farming enterprise with a move to Camphill Farm taking the Homilton flock with them, and this has been home for the past 40 years.

The Bluefaced Leicester flock changed in 2003 with the introduction of some Snab Green bloodlines and became a crossing type flock. Currently running at 30 breeding ewes which are all home bred and naturally served, with nothing kept over 5 crop. New bloodlines are introduced

with the purchase of stock rams from the annual excursion to the Hawes ram sale at the end of September, new bloodlines introduced to the flock recently have come from Highberries, Glenrath and Asby Hall. When John is looking for a new stock ram he is looking for a sheep with style, plenty of body, colour and a sharp outlook to breed him the best mules he can for the commercial buyer. Bluefaced Leicester ram lambs are kept and are sold as shearlings annually at the Association sale at Carlisle to repeat buyers at the beginning of October.

Camphill is also home to a flock of 600 Hexham Blackface Ewes, 300 Mules and 200 Texel x Ewes. All breeding

sheep are sold through the autumn sales at Hexham Mart, the homebred mules are sold as gimmers and ewe lambs through the later sales to repeat buyers. All the prime lambs are sold through the live ring at Longtown Mart. There is also a cattle enterprise running 140 suckler cows with the calves sold between 16 - 18 months old.

After almost 50 years since he started breeding Bluefaced Leicesters, John hopes they will continue to have a home at Camphill for a long time to come and is looking forward to Spring to see what the new bloodlines bring for next year.

# John Minnis

## Mossvale Flock 1463

Farming only 8 miles from the hustle and bustle of Belfast City near the village of Comber we find one of the earliest established flocks of Bluefaced Leicesters in Northern Ireland. The Mossvale flock of traditional Bluefaced Leicesters is the proud property of John Minnis.

The farm sits at 400 feet and is a mixture of arable and pastureland. John farms on his own, with the aim to produce pedigree sheep to meet modern requirements with some of the additional pastureland let for silage production. The farm has been the property of the Minnis family going back to the 1700's. John and his father established the flock back in 1982 with lambs first registered in 1983. The foundation ewes for the flock came from a purchase of three gimmers from the Glentoo flock (312) of Jock McCulloch, Bridge of Dee, Castle Douglas who was famous in his day for wool production. In the early days of the flock being established influential sires which left their stamp were Hobsland Maradona and Barlaes Elite Plus Taylor Made who was purchased for 3,600gns out of Castle Douglas and the more recent purchase of Rossiebank F001. John was asked why the Bluefaced Leicester suits his farming requirements? John stated "the Bluefaced Leicester is a good natured sheep, elegant and easily handled, and an easy sheep to lamb" John believes "the Bluefaced Leicester is a highly valuable pedigree animal especially when crossed with Blackface and Cheviot ewes and hopefully the demand for Bluefaced Leicesters will increase in years to come due to the popularity of the cheviot mule.

In the good old days John used to really enjoy showing his sheep and catching up with fellow members and breeders especially at the Royal Ulster Agricultural Show at Balmoral and his greatest achievement to date was winning the Interbreed Championship with Hobsland Maradona back in 1990. John currently runs a flock of 20 ewes with 12 ewe lambs, rams are sold at association sales at Ballymena, Kelso and Carlisle. John is always looking out to see how his bloodlines do for other breeders and is always delighted when good prices are achieved. When looking for a new stock ram John looks for a nice blue head, bright eye, good mouth, skin and a good sturdy leg in each corner. This year John has invested in some new bloodlines from the Burndale flock of Derek Henderson for his R001 ram lamb bought out of NSA Wales and Border Ram Sales for 6200gns, Derek did say to John "he is probably the best ram I have ever bred".

The red tickets didn't stop there either for the Riddings team as the scooped the progeny championship with 3 gimmers shearlings by the aforementioned Skeughdale tup, completing a great day at the show for them.

Taking the reserve championship in the progeny section were the Pedleys from Yore House with a very impressive trio of tup lambs sired by the Midlock Commander

bought out of Hawes last year, with his progeny looking good, having already taking red tickets at the Yorkshire Show for the Pye family. # Scottish Progeny Show – Peebles Show

**Under a blisteringly hot sun at Peebles show, hosts of the Scottish Progeny Show, the judges and competitors braved the conditions, more akin to the Sahara than Scotland. The heat was on, in more ways than one, and the competition was good, with some great sheep from both sides of the Borders battling for the top awards.**

In the traditional section, under the sharp eye of Derek Henderson, Burndale, Alan McClymont enjoyed a great day. Derek started off in dapper style, but as the sun shone, he lost his jacket and gained a Carrs Billington baseball cap, worn at a nice jaunty angle....yet he retained his tie and composure all day! The Kirkstead flock took 5 of the 6 first prizes on offer, and in the gimmer lamb class, which saw 17 lambs out, they scooped the top three tickets. The odds were always high that they would take the red, white, and blue ticket, and they did, with again the champion adding to the Highland title picked up in June. This monster of a tup was bought at Kelso last year for £3200 from Tudor Harris and his Bonvilston flock. They also took the reserve champion ticket too, with a ewe being shown for the first time. This lively 2 crop ewe is by the Burndale G1 tup which has excelled

in the Kirkstead flock and is out of a ewe bought at the Carry House dispersal sale as a gimmer hogg and is by the Heddon Valley X4. This ewe also went onto form a championship partnership with another ewe by the G1 Burndale to take the Progeny champion.

Taking the reserve championship place in the progeny section was Martin Quinn from the Whinnyhall flock, travelling all the way down from Fife to compete. His reserves were a trio of tup lambs by his Bonvilston tup, which has been proving something of a sire for him and putting the flock firmly on the map. These tup lambs stood 1, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> in the open class too. Out of ewes by Mendick D14, Craig Yr Orsedd H10 and Burndale J2 respectively, with the first placed lamb a full brother to last years £3000 lamb sold at Bultth and the first two will be heading down there too later next month.

# Scottish Progeny Show – Peebles Show

## Crossing Type & Mule Progeny

Kindly Judged by Mr Andrew Hunter, Steel

13<sup>th</sup> August 2022

**Judging was completed first in the crossing section, which saw some very strong classes, especially in the gimmer lamb class, which saw 18 sheep forward, eventually won by the Dawyck flock.**

Winning the overall championship was the Midlock gimmer which had stood champion at the Highland earlier in the season, a full sister to the £40,000 Commander sold at Hawes last year, and by all accounts doing very well. By the Riddings M1 and out of the L27 Midlock ewe, which is a bit of a golden goose at the flock, breeding some real toppers for them. This classy gimmer, oozing quality also caught the eye of the interbreed judge, James Warnock, too, as he placed her his Reserve Interbreed Champion on the day.

The reserve champion came out of the same class as the champion, from Finlay Robertson at the Beeches flock, with a lovely smart, stretchy gimmer shearling which was always going to catch the eye just with her presence. This smasher is by L22 Blarnavaid and out of a ewe by B41 Hewgill. The Beeches flock enjoyed further success when they won the mule Championship with a gimmer lamb by the homebred P6 Beeches, a son of the massive L2 Sealhouses which they bought of Hawes and showed successfully at the Highland last year.

The progeny classes saw a great turn out, with some strong classes, which had judge, Andy Hunter, thinking deep. Topping this section was a pair of lambs (one tup lamb and one gimmer lamb) from Martyn Archer by the £28,000 P1 Carry House Ronaldo, that he sold last year in Hawes, selling to Temain and Mistyburn flocks in Northern Ireland and retaining a share in it as well. These lambs were full of colour, with good skins and a shimmering depth of white too. Not just producing the goods in the BFL department, the same sire went on to take the mule progeny championship as well, with a trio of smart gimmer lambs all by him. It looks as if this progeny will be worth keeping an eye on at this year's autumns sales.

Despite the searing heat, a good time was had by all, with a great spirit throughout the show. It was great to see so many sheep and competitors there as well as onlookers from throughout Scotland and the North of England. Next year, if the weather continues like this, the committee are thinking of introducing a class for camels.

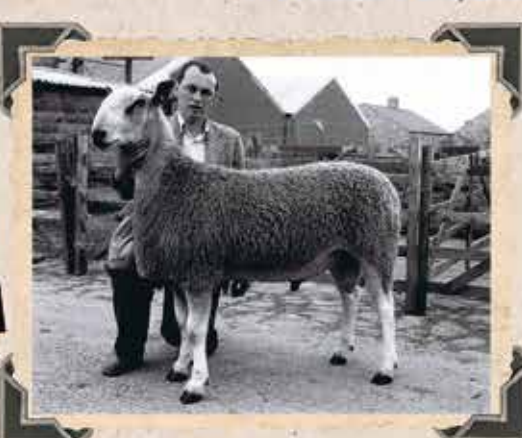

# JAMIE PIRIE

## Blarnavaid Flock 4244

Ewe Lambs by P1 Blarnavaid, sold in Hawes for £12000, with a share retained

Based just inside the Loch Lomand & Trossachs National Park near Drymen, Blarnavaid is family owned, with John & Mary Pirie and son Jamie running around 290 acres on which they keep 150 Blackie ewes with 110 going to the Bluefaced Leicester tups to breed Scotch Mules, the other 40 Blackie ewes run pure to breed their own replacements.

Alongside the Blackies they have a flock of 90 Scotch Mule ewes which get tupped by Suffolk X Beltex tups to breed some cracking fat lambs. Mule ewe lambs are sold private to a repeat customer who has been returning for the lambs for the past 8 years. Alongside the sheep the farm carries 90 Suckler cattle a mixture of British Blue X Limmy and Charolais cattle, with suckler calves getting sold at 12-16 months old off grass through United Auctions at Stirling and Lanark.

Many 9 year old youngsters dream of Christmas and compose list after list of what they are wanting from Santa. Young Jamie Pirie was no different, but his list was a simple one not Lego or toy farm machinery ... a couple of in lamb crossing ewes, which he got, though goodness knows how they wrapped them up and got them under the Christmas tree. These foundation ewes came from Derek and the late Douglas Hall from the Firth flock. It was back to Firth again when in 2008, after saving up his Christmas and Birthday money, he went and purchased a further 5 ewe lambs, full of good bloodlines got by some greats of the breed, N25 Nunsleugh, W25 Controversy, V3 Bull & Cave and T5 Dreva. These sheep went on to set the base for the Blarnavaid flock and helped it get where it is today and today, from that small start, they run 25 breeding ewes. He has to be "sore" on them when

selecting females to keep as he knows all too well how quickly numbers can increase but feels that by being hard on selection, he can maintain the best quality of females possible.

Jamie has always been keen on the crossing type and likes his sheep to be good bodied with good skins with a good mouth and correct on their legs, as well as good flashy colour too. It seems to be a winning combination as the demand for the Blarnavaid sheep can be seen in the sales rings around the country at the autumn sales. On the ram side of things, he followed the Firth breeding using four stock tups off them in the early years, building up a flock with depth of consistency. One of the tups to put down a marker in the flock was the £13,000 Highberries Hotshot, a son of the F1 Oak House which did well for the Highberries flock. He did well for the flock, putting some of the best crossing bloodlines into their sheep. They shared this tup with Andrew Campbell from Overburns and when they went shopping to Hawes a couple of years later, they joined together to land the £37,000 K20 Midlock for a then breed record, a brave move for Jamie, but one that has paid off with his progeny and sheep out of his progeny going on and doing well, leaving that powerful stamp throughout the flock. The best tup lambs are sold through Hawes and Carlisle each

autumn and he has seen demand for his sheep grow year on year, with a best for his shearlings being £5500 at UA Stirling ram sales, the best for lambs saw a bid of £14,000 at Hawes, which was by a homebred son of the Hotshot. Later born tup lambs are retained to use at home or sent out to repeat customers, with around 14 each year being used on the Blackie ewes as Jamie feels it is vital to see the mule lambs off them, as at the end of the day that's what they are all about. He also sells a few select females every year at Carlisle and at the Lock Down Ladies sale in 2020 he sold an in-lamb gimmer shearling by L12 Shafthill for £5800 for his best female price so far.

The Blues are Jamie's own project, and he always remembers some good advice from the late Douglas Hall, who told him "Never look back on the disasters with blues, always dust yourself down and keep looking forward" which is probably a great way to look at it as there are always hurdles in the road from time to time. The Blarnavaid flock has enjoyed plenty of success in the show ring too, which sees them each year starting off with the local show at Drymen moving through to Gargunnock in the first week of June, where they have

had plenty of success over the years with both the mules and the Blues, working up to the Big One, the Highland Show. They have done well at the Highland, but his big ambition is to take the coveted championship at the show. Whilst Jamie enjoys the showing it is all taken in good heart and not taken too seriously, it is more about the social side, catching up with old friends and enjoying the craic.

As well as working at home with his dad and uncle at Blarnavaid part time he works full time on his mothers' side of the family on a 1000-acre dairy farm for the McKenzies near Ardmore where they also run 600 store cattle as well as running a flock of 700 sheep, buying in 500 mule ewe lambs with an extra 60 home bred as well with us tupping our 100 blackie ewes with Blarnavaid blue tup lambs and stock tups, 40 mule ewes as well. We run 460 of the mule ewe lambs with Texel tups and sell hoggs with lambs at foot at UA Stirling then the rest and the ones that don't take the tup get sold as mule gimmers through UA Stirling. As well as all this, as if that wasn't enough, they also run a construction and contracting business too. Its no wonder Jamie needs a nice relaxing hobby like breeding Bluefaced Leicester sheep to keep him sane!

# Southern Ireland Progeny Show – Tullamore Show

**Tullamore Show took place on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> August. A very warm day saw people from all over Ireland swarm to the Showgrounds.**

Judge Myrfyn Roberts from Wales worked determinedly through the heat of the day to select his champions in both Bluefaced Leicester and Mule Sections.

The Bluefaced Leicester champion was a hogget ewe shown by Paul Sammon of the Firmount Flock. This ewe hogg had caught the eye of the judge earlier in the day for her style and presence in her own class and was a worthy recipient of the championship. She was got by N001 Drummuck bought by Paul 2 years ago in Ballymena who is proving to be very influential in the Firmount Flock. The reserve female champion also came out of the same Ashdown pen this time it was a homebred ewe lamb again by the L014 Espley sire. The Montagues are reducing their stock of females and rams throughout the sales this Autumn with a batch heading to the NSA Wales & Border Ram Sales at Builth Wells with another batch of females heading to Welshpool. The reserve male championship was awarded to Richard Turner with

his aged ram 3246/N003 Heddon Valley Napoleon bred by Barry Nicholls, Napoleon will be heading to the Builth Wells Sale in September.

In the Progeny Classes another tremendous show of groups were forward. Taking the overall champion Bluefaced Leicester Progeny Group was Brian Dallyn, Killington with his pair of homebred ram lambs by the same sire. 1925/R001 and R002 are twins born in March sired by Trofarth 4394/P001 which Brian purchased out of Welshpool in 2021, he was the top priced ram lamb at the sale selling for 1200gns. ## **‘BRINDIFIELD’ BREEDING BOTH TYPES OF BLUEFACED LEICESTER TO SUIT ALL MARKETS.**

Mr R Turner, Brindifield Flock 3037

Situated in an area of outstanding natural beauty equidistant between Honiton and Cullompton on the edge of the Blackdown Hills in Devon you will find Homeleigh House, which is home to Richard Turner and his partner Janet and the Brindifield flock of Bluefaced Leicesters which has been the base for the flock since 2005.

The flock was established in 1994, with the first registrations in 1995 and consists of 50 Bluefaced Leicesters with a third being traditional and two thirds being crossing type. Richard farms alone with the help of Janet and occasionally his son Jack at busy times, the farm consists of 65 acres of owned and rented land, which is mostly grade 3 rising to 700 feet above sea level. Due to only having limited acreage the farm is mainly made up of pedigree stock including a flock of pedigree Lleyn's. This enables Richard to sell the majority for breeding purposes and therefore add value to their stock.

Richard's first purchases in the Bluefaced Leicester world were two traditional in lamb ewes from the 'Cannington flock' of Mr Geoffrey Cox, with later purchases from 'Beeston' and 'Lyneside' with a further two ewes purchased at the dispersal in lamb sale of the 'Walton' flock they were 468/X015 (the mother of Walton Rocket) and 468/X017. These two ewes have had a great influence in the flock with the majority of the traditional ewes still descended from these bloodlines. Since Richard established the flock a varied selection of sires have been used with Richard travelling the Country to source rams from 'Walton', 'Pennine' and 'Cernyw'. Over the years four rams have been used from friend and fellow Devonian

Barry Nicholls of the Heddon Valley flock 3246/C002, 3246/K002, 3246/L005 and 3246/N003.

Back in 2007 Richard and son Jack took the step to expand and introduce a crossing type section to their Bluefaced Leicester flock this was after a visit to Brian Davis at Ty-Gwyn flock and two ewe lambs were purchased which were put in lamb 'for luck'. This was followed by a trip up the motorway to Carlisle where a ram lamb was bought from the 'Wellan' flock of Ricky Lund with later purchases of ewes from 'Carry House', 'Firth' and 'Midlock'. Sires used within the flock include Blarnavaid 4244/H007, Yore House 790/L002, 3037/M001 (he is a homebred son of Yore House L002 and Hamildean 4348/N001 (a son of Newbigging Walls L011 'The Ghost').

Richard and Janet really enjoy the showing side of the breed and it gives them a chance to meet up with fellow breeders and show off their sheep to potential new purchasers. Devon County Show has always been a favourite and over the years the flock have had success with both types winning breed champion and reserve breed champion with the traditional type, and in 2017 taking the overall breed champion with a crossing type shearling ram.

In 2012 during the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary year of the Bluefaced Leicester Association the South West Club held a flock competition and Richard and Janet were delighted to win best group of shearling ewes and reserve overall champion flock. Ten years later and the South West Club held a progeny show to commemorate the 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year and this found Richard and Janet more success in the show ring taking awards in both sections. In the traditional section Richard took the reserve male championship with his aged ram 3246/N003 Heddon Valley Napoleon bred by Barry Nicholls. In the progeny section taking the first prize pair of ewe lambs by the same sire.

In the crossing section Richard again took the reserve male championship this time with his homebred ram Brindifield 3037/M001 sired by 790/L002 Yore House. And in the progeny classes taking the first prize pair of shearling gimmers by the same sire, 790/L002 Yore House.

Richard sells his Bluefaced Leicesters at the association sale at NSA Builth Wells and his local sale at Tavistock, occasionally at Carlisle and privately. At this years NSA Wales and Border ram sales Richards home bred ram Brindifield 3037/N002 sired the top price traditional ram lamb sold by Wynn & Siwan Harries, Hope flock selling at 15,000gns, they also sold two other lambs sired by the same Brindifield ram to 3000gns and 2600gns. Richards own sale highlight was selling a crossing lamb sired by Shafthill K001 at Builth Wells in 2019 for 1400gns. When looking for a new stock ram Richard looks for a tup with a good mouth, sound in the legs with good conformation and overall style, he also has to have the correct bloodlines. Richard looks at the female lines behind the rams as he believes these lines have a huge influence on the future breeding of the offspring as well as the sire's influence.

For the future Richard and Janet will continue to keep traditional and crossing type Bluefaced Leicesters, as they have a market place for both types with returning customers with both pedigree breeders and commercial buyers.

Once again the progeny show was held in Welshpool Livestock mart and drew a good crowd of sheep in, both pures and mules from all over Wales, and some strong classes and with 17 gimmer lambs forward and 11 tup lambs in their respective classes, as well as many other strong classes, there was plenty for judge Kate Smith, Low Arkland, to work her way through.

Her champion from the individual classes came from the gimmer lamb class where Elfyn Owen, Cernyw reigned supreme. His gimmer lamb certainly caught the eye, she was very sweet and full of style and pedigree. She is by the noted D3 Howlea which was bought by son Ifan at Carlisle as a lamb and resold as a two shear, back up at Carlisle, where he took the championship and sold to the Cocklaw flock. He has bred very well for the flock, including a female Champion at the Royal Welsh. The mother of this ewe has breeding going way back, being by a homebred tup lamb, Cernyw T1, which was born in 2002, with a half share sold to Glenn Shapiro, and by the R1 Carry House. Elfyn also took the reserve male champion with a tup lamb by the noted Addingham B1, after they bought a handful of straws last year. Elfyn had always been a fan of the tup, which was sold as a shearling at Kelso, and felt the time was right to put some of those bloodlines into his sheep. His mother again goes back to the Carry House R1.

The male champion and Reserve overall came from Dewi and Meinir Parry, who run a small flock of just 10 ewes, with R2 Nant-y-Glyd, a stonking tup lamb by the noted Kirkstead K3, a son of the Burndale G1, which has had a glittering show career himself, twice taking the championship at the Royal Welsh. His twin brother was the reserve male champion at Anglesey last week. They have admired the Kirkstead tup and his breeding for a while and invested in some semen last year to bring these bloodlines into their

flock. He and his brothers will be heading to the Carlisle sale later this autumn.

In the progeny section it was noted breeder Aled Jones, Craig-yr-Orsedd who came out top, taking home the BFL 60th anniversary Sash, which was draped over his three smart March born gimmer lambs all sired by Daisy N4, which he bought out of Builth last year off Marcus Williams. He was by a Woodcroft tup which Aled has been keeping an eye on as he seen progeny by him and was impressed with it. Two of the lambs were out of ewes by the homebred J25, which was the sire to the first prize progeny group of gimmer shearlings too, and one was out of a ewe by another homebred tup, H3.

Taking reserve place in the progeny section were Myrfyn and Gareth Roberts from Anglesey, with a pair of performance recorded tup lamb and gimmer lambs, sired by the homebred P1 Myfyrian which they retained last year. He is a son of the M1 Lowes Fell which has been doing well for them. They had a good day out, bringing a full trailer all the way down, and also picked up both champion and reserve in the mule progeny sections too, winning with 3 Beulah mule gimmer lambs by P8 Myfyrian X and reserve with 3 cheviot mules by P5 Myfyrian.

The mule classes were won by Owain Rowlands, Rhaydaer, who took champion with a white-faced mule and then completed a great day by taking the reserve place with a Beulah mule gimmer lamb too.

# TYWYN BLUEFACED LEICESTERS PERFORMANCE RECORDING SINCE 1979

Mr William Williams-Wynne, Tywyn flock 907

Overlooking breath taking views of Cardigan Bay is the home of the Tywyn flock of Traditional Bluefaced Leicesters, under the ownership of Mr William Williams-Wynne. The farm which runs to over 500 hectares stretches from sea level marshes up to 1,620 feet of un-improved mountain. William took over the tenancy of the farm in September 1969 and now farms on his own with the help of a contract shepherd who has been a good friend for many years.

From the age of 18 – 20 William spent time in New Zealand working his way around farms in the South Island. As a result of this experience his farming strategy has been based on an easy-care low stocking / low-input philosophy. Currently the flock is made up of 32 ewes and 8 yearling females. The ram lambs are kept and sold as shearlings the following year. The NSA ram sale at Builth Wells used to be his trading market of choice, but these days William prefers to sell his stock at Welshpool. He told me that he prefers Welshpool market because ‘we all know each other, and you tend to find a hardier and leaner ram on offer there’. Williams’ aim is that none of his yearling rams have cost him more than £150 in total to present for sale.

The flock was established in 1978 with some ewe lambs from Geoff White, of Fotherley Buildings and with rams bought in from the East Fourstones and Ormathwaite flocks. These were the flocks that William found had the best mouths and as a Welsh hill farmer William understood how vital a good mouth is if you want the

offspring to last more than a couple of seasons. The following year he signed his flock (907) up to Signet (5574) for performance recording. From his experience in New Zealand his priority was breed survivability and economic feed conversion. When William was asked if any ram or ewe has had a major influence on the flock “yes” he replied, “but that I am afraid is my secret”. What William was willing to divulge however, was that he has always chosen tups because of their lack of faults rather than for their looks. The result he said was that when he gets a ram home from the market they always look better in the field than it did in the sale ring. William was also asked how the Bluefaced Leicester suited his farming requirements? He explained that when he was younger the farm used to run 4000/5000 Welsh Mountain Ewes and at that time Wales was in desperate need of a hardier and more prolific breed than the Border Leicester Half Bred, and the Oldenburgh rams that were the norm in those days. ‘We needed more sale options and with so many lambs to trade, the Bluefaced Leicester-sired Mule lambs offered a much wider choice of potential markets.

Welsh Mule ewe lambs were hardy excellent breeders, which could also be sold as store lambs or to the fat lamb market. Having a large extensive flock as we did they were also so much easier to lamb than Suffolk and Oldenburgh crosses.' As a result of this need the Welsh Mule Sheep Breeders Association was born and William became one of its founding members being member number 4.

When William was asked about his future plans for his flock he said that "Watching this year's crop of lambs strutting their stuff out of the kitchen window in the Spring was like watching young thoroughbred horses taking the air. They looked magnificent. I guess that is why after 53 years of breeding Bluefaced Leicesters I reckon I'll keep them to

the very end!" Although William is now 75 years old he still likes to keep busy. In his spare time he can be found building a small aeroplane, or flying one of the drones which he uses to check the flock (without disturbing them), and then each year around May-time, when time and covid allows he is off on his motorbike around the world. Next year it is a return to North Africa. William had expected to be able to retire in order to spend more time with grand children and hobbies, but as John Lennon said "Life happens to you while you're busy making other plans!" Like most Bluefaced breeders William is already looking forward to next season's lambing and praying for plentiful grass!
